## **OPERATIONS UPDATE**

### Rewilding - Tree Planting in Malvern

As part of the work of the Town Council's Environmental Panel, four Town Council sites have been identified and allocated as areas for wilding. In February the Town Council's Operations Team planted 500 trees in green and open spaces at Greenfields Road and Yates Hay Road. These trees are a mixture of British native woodland species such as oak, hawthorn, ash, birch, beech and willow. The saplings are already well established, and are settling into their environment quickly. Three sites have been identified where mowing will cease in certain areas to create wilding are also for wildlife and insect communities to thrive.

#### **Station Road Gardens Lighting**

The Town Council is planning to upgrade eight of the Elgar electric gas light Grosvenor lanterns during the summer of 2021. The last major refurbishment of the lighting columns and luminaires was in 2013 and these gas lamps are now due for major refurbishment. The work carried out on gas lamps is highly specialised and the Town Council employs a local contractor who carries out work on heritage lighting in all areas of Malvern.

#### **Bus Shelter Refurbishments**



We have two bus shelter refurbishment projects underway: one in Great Malvern, by Rose Bank Gardens and the second bus shelter which is a listed art deco building is in Barnards Green. Both bus shelters are of architectural interest and are well used and these works will help to ensure that they remain both well maintained, and in keeping with their original designs.

#### Victoria Park

Whilst most Town Council projects have continued despite the pandemic, unfortunately the opening of the two new basketball courts has now been delayed by about a year. The world class flex court surfacing is being supplied and installed by a Belgian company and they are still awaiting the relaxation of travel restrictions to be able to lay the surfacing. The Council is hopeful that this may happen later this summer.

There is also a project underway to replace the pavilion at Victoria Park. The current pavilion has come to the end of its life and is no longer fit for purpose. The Council plan to build a new pavilion to improve the park's facilities for its many users.

#### Rose Bank Gardens

As summer approaches, the Town Council's Operations staff have been turning their attention to Rose Bank Gardens and getting up to date with general maintenance and planting so that it will soon be looking at its best. Sadly, the tree in the entranceway bed was showing signs of decay and needed to be removed and Town Council staff have been busy planting some bedding plants in this area to brighten up this gateway to the hills. Later in the year, works will begin on a new fountain for the gardens, with works also planned to improve some of the pathways and path edging.

#### New Chipper

The Town Council has recently bought a new woodchipper. This machine will enable the council to recycle much of its prunings, and arboriculture arisings that occur throughout the year as well as reducing the need for contractors costs in taking waste away. The woodchipper will be used around Malvern in various locations.
