Welcome to this Newsletter

Why did I stand for a second term as Mayor?

The main reason for standing again is to work better and harder for Malvern. I think I can do this better this



year due to the experience of being Mayor last year. At least I know what is expected of me this year in real terms rather than being told about things doing them means you learn first-hand! As twenty councillors we can make small but significant differences to our town and I am proud to lead the council in its work. It has been a great start to the new Mayoral year as we have celebrated the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and we will soon have the Commonwealth Games Baton coming through Malvern, on 22 July.

My Mayoral Charity for 2022/23

I have chosen Guide Dogs as my Mayoral charity because they help make sure that people living with sight loss don't lose their freedom as well. But more than that, they work with children and adults alike in providing information about sight loss. In addition to guide dogs, they also provide "buddy" dogs to children with sight loss to build confidence and well-being. I have set an ambitious fundraising target for 2022/23 of £10,000 as this will enable us to name and train a guide dog puppy, supporting them through their training. Of course, if we meet our fundraising target, then a competition will be held in Malvern to choose a name for the guide dog puppy, so I do hope you will come along and support our fundraising events, the first of which will be my Mayor's Bonanza in Victoria Park on 28 August.



News from the Ground



Refurbishment of Bus Shelters - Barnards Green Bus Shelter which is

Grade II listed has undergone a major refurbishment. The Town Council decided to change the colour scheme back to that which existed in 1998 with the exterior painted white with dark blue banding and the interior yellow, in keeping with the Art Deco style. The Remembrance poppies which are an integral part of this war memorial's décor have been carefully repainted, new bulkhead lighting has been installed and the existing benches restored.

Another iconic bus shelter situated just below Rosebank Gardens is also currently undergoing refurbishment. The old canopy has been removed and will be replaced with a new steel and Georgian blue glass canopy in keeping with the original design. Works will also be taking place to repair the surrounding walls.

Jubilee Obelisk - To celebrate Her Majesty the

Queen's Platinum Jubilee, a special Jubilee Obelisk has been erected in the entrance to Rosebank Gardens. A metal spiral band from top to bottom is adorned with rose blooms and there is a gold Royal crown at the top. Queen Elizabeth II roses have been placed at the base of the structure, which was officially unveiled by the Mayor, Cllr Nick Houghton shortly before the Jubilee weekend.

Play Areas - In February/March 2022, the Town Council spent over \pounds 10,000 refurbishing the children's play area at Jamaica Crescent and purchasing new springers for Lower Howsell and Victoria Park play areas. These works are part of



the annual refurbishment schedule to review and update equipment across the Town Council's 11 play areas. Later this year refurbishment works are planned for Michael Crescent.



Bug Hotels - A bug hotel is a manmade structure created to provide shelter for insects and minibeasts and as part of this year's Malvern in Bloom activities, a project that started prior to lockdown has now come to fruition. With the help of Malvern's Men's Shed who made about 20 bug hotels and Travis Perkins who provided the materials to create them, the hotels were then sent to local primary schools and nurseries to be filled and decorated. Congratulations to Play House Nursery and St Matthias Primary School who won their categories for the most creatively decorated bug hotel.

New Recycling Bins - Malvern Town Council and Malvern Hills District Council have joined forces to help reduce waste by installing new recycling bins outside schools. Five trial recycling bins have been put in place outside the two main secondary schools within Malvern, Dyson Perrins and The Chase.

Malvern, Dyson Perrins and The Chase. It is hoped that engagement with school pupils will encourage them to use the bins and help foster new habits, leading to increased recycling within the town and hopefully expansion of

this scheme in the future.
