"About Your Town Council"

Welcome to the spring newsletter for 2023. As we look ahead to a busy spring and summer period with a calendar full of events and a number of exciting projects to progress, we thought it would be a good time for a quick recap on what your local Town Council does.







Malvern Town Council is responsible for the care and maintenance of a large number of assets within the Town. These include Great Malvern Cemetery, Rosebank Gardens, two allotment sites, eleven play areas, football pitches, two sports pavilions, a skateboard park, 20 gas lamps, litter bins, bus shelters, benches, as well as a large number of green and open spaces throughout the town. Current projects being worked on are a new building for Victoria Park and provision of recreational facilities on new land off Clover Way.

The Council organises a range of events throughout the Town for the benefit of local residents. These include of Bands in the Park, the Christmas light switch-on, the $\left|\frac{\vec{n}}{\vec{n}}\right|$ Mayor's Bonanza and a Health & Wellbeing Fair. A number of fundraising events are also held to support the Mayoral charity each year.



Malvern Town Council has twenty Councillors who, after the May elections, will represent nine wards. There are seventeen members of staff ranging from a fulltime Town Clerk to a part-time gate-keeper at the Cemetery. Nearly all of the

events and grounds maintenance works are run by Town Council staff along with some volunteers, thus helping

to keep service delivery high and costs low.The Town Council is here to represent the views of residents and comments on planning applications submitted to Malvern Hills District Council as well as lobbying other organisations on key issues. The Council also has a Neighbourhood Plan and runs a bi-annual grants scheme.

Elections - Voting

From **Thursday 4 May 2023** voters will be required by law (Elections Act 2022) to show an approved form of **photographic identification** to polling station staff before being issued with a ballot paper.

If you don't have any of the accepted forms of photographic identification you will be able to apply either in person, by post or online, for a Voter Authority Certificate – this is a free photographic identification document.

News from the Ground

Mill Lane

Malvern Town Council has now taken ownership of an area of recreational This land has been gifted to the Council by the Charlock Road housing land off Clover Way and adjacent to the council-owned Adam Lea play area. developer along with a payment for its future maintenance. A public consultation has now been carried out to ask residents what the future uses of this land should be, with ideas such as a wilding area, more play area equipment, and a bike pump track being put forward.



Rosebank Gardens

Rosebank Gardens Entranceway Bed - the entranceway bed to Rosebank Gardens has recently been raised at the front by approximately one metre to give a level planting surface. The bed has been raised using oak sleepers and planted with Precious Ruby bush roses which will produce scarlet-red blooms from June Precious Ruby bush roses which will produce scarlet-red blooms from June to September.





New Fencing - new hoop-top fencing has been installed, along the lower pathway on the western boundary of Rosebank Gardens. This replaces the previous fencing which was in a bad state of repair and helps to improve the appearance of the gardens.

Bus Shelter Outside Rose Bank Gardens - Refurbishment works have been taking place to the bus shelter outside Rose Bank Gardens. The new canopy has been made and fitted and anthracite metal cladding fixed to the rear wall, the remaining works are glazing of the canopy and reinstating the benches.



Malvern Sign - the Town Council will be installing a new 'Malvern' sign behind the new wall and bench to the left of the 99 steps in Rosebank Gardens (as pictured). These galvanized steel letters will be of a 3D boxed design and 1m in height. This unique sign will encourage visitors into the town and gardens whilst being sympathetic to the environment of Rosebank Gardens.

New Electrical Vehicle - the Town Council has recently ordered a Corvus Terrain EX4 Utility Vehicle or electric buggy. This vehicle has a four-wheel-drive capability, a heated cab for winter use as well as 60 mile range per charge, it is also in line with the Council's environmental policy.
