THE SEVEN ACTIONS

WEARING THE WHITE RIBBON

1

Encourage people to wear a White Ribbon and make the White Ribbon Promise to never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women.

WHITE RIBBON AMBASSADORS AND CHAMPIONS

2

Ensure that at least one person in your organisation becomes a White Ribbon Ambassador or Champion.

AWARENESS RAISING AND FUNDRAISING

3

Hold an awareness-raising (and fundraising if appropriate) event each year.

DISPLAYING THE WHITE RIBBON

4

Show that you support White Ribbon by displaying the Supporter Organisation badge on your website, email signatures and in public places.

WHITE RIBBON DAY

5

Mark White Ribbon Day, 25 November, every year, using our resources.

POLICIES AND GUIDANCE

6

Have policies and guidelines in place that protect staff and support them if they experience harassment, abuse and violence.

SIGNPOSTING TO HELP AND SUPPORT

7

Ensure people know where they can get help and support by sharing information among staff, through signage and online.
